APPLICATION

- In times of trouble do you run to God with your needs or do you begin with praise? Discuss.
- Have you determined that you "will praise the Lord?" Why or why not.
- Why do we have a tendency to let our emotions, rather than our will, control whether we praise God or not?
- Tell one another of God's wonderful deeds. Perhaps everyone share what God is doing or is teaching them.
- Do you ground your prayer requests on your accomplishments or God's character? Discuss
- God is the great judge. What impact does that truth have on you?

- What action/repentance does God want you to take according to the truths of this text?
- Are there any other prayer needs?
