INSTRUCTIONS

OPENING DISCUSSION

- What was the most interesting idea/concept about Sunday's sermon?
- Do feel pressure to that pulls you away from the Lord or his commands? Discuss.

REVIEW

- Have someone read 2 Thess 2:15-17
- In your own words what does it mean to stand firm?
- What is the apostolic tradition to which Paul refers?
- What is the good hope? How does hope provide comfort?
- What is Paul asking for when prays that God would establish them?

APPLICATION

- What must the church do to ensure its gospel-centered focus? What are some things that would detract a church from having/maintaining this focus?
- The three pressures that threaten our stability are opposition, false teaching and temptation. Which of these threats poses the greatest challenge to you? Discuss.
- Why do you think so many Christians do not stand firm?
- How can we keep from drifting away from Scripture?
- What role does the church play it providing our stability?
- Are you a hopeful person? Is that hope comforting? Explain.
- When was a time when you felt God's strength?

PRAYER (divide the group based on gender if desired)

- What action/repentance does God want you to take according to the truths of this text?
- Are there any other prayer needs?
