INSTRUCTIONS

This guide is meant to facilitate discussion which will lead to a response to God's word. Therefore, please use it as tool that best fits the needs of your community group.

OPENING DISCUSSION

- Read Ezra Ch 8:15-36.
- What do you find interesting/compelling/confusing about this passage?
- Are you a Practical Peter (God gave us a mind, so let's use it) or a Spiritual Sam (I have a big God, so let's depend on him to work in amazing ways)? Discuss.

REVIEW

- How does Ezra respond to a lack of Levites (v15)?
- From 8:21-23, what does it look like to seek God?
- Why does Ezra refuse the King's military escort (v22)?
- Why do they fast (v21, v23)? What is fasting and why is it important?
- Ezra appeals to God's holiness to motivate faithfulness in 8:28. What is the connection between the power of God's wrath in 8:22 and the appeal to God's holiness in 8:28?

APPLICATION

- If you had been in Ezra's shoes when no Levites joined the party of returnees (8:15), how would you have responded?
- Was Ezra right in rejecting military provision? What about Nehemiah (Neh 2:7-9)?
- How do we know when we should take a bold step of faith (like rejecting a military escort) and when we should walk by faith by using means and policies (like counting the money)?
- Have you ever taken a bold step of faith and then God miraculously provided? Discuss.
- Is prayer your first instinct in times of trouble or indecision?

PRAYER (divide the group based on gender if desired)

- What action/repentance does God want you to take according to the truths of this text?
- Are there any other prayer needs
