REVIEW

- What does it mean that God is jealous for his land (v18)?
- Why is God concerned that they no longer be a reproach for the nations (v19)?
- What is the difference between rejoicing in what God has done and rejoicing in God himself (vv21, 23)?

APPLICATION

- What role does the hope of heaven play in your life?
- What can we do to keep the fog of circumstances from obscuring our understanding of what the Lord is doing?
- Do you ever deny aberrant feelings with audacious faith? Discuss.
- Has the Lord restored unto you the years the locusts have eaten? Discuss.

PRAYER (divide the group based on gender if desired)

- What action/repentance does God want you to take according to the truths of this text?
